

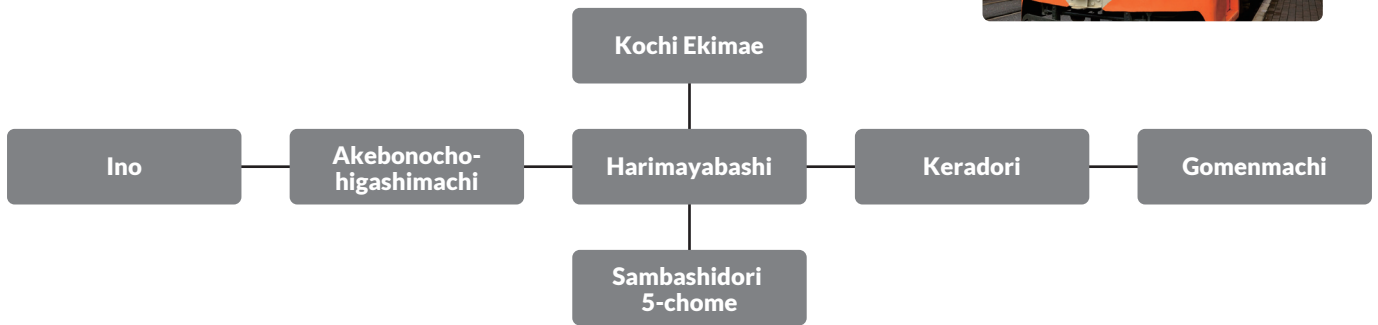

### Kochi City (Streetcar)



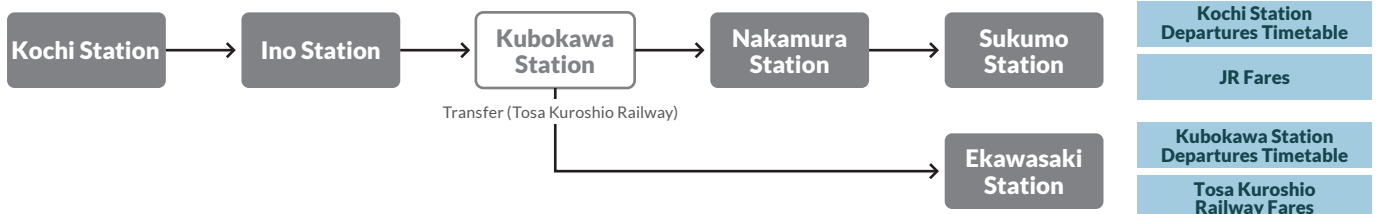
One Day Train Pass - Flat fare zone in Kochi city: ¥500 All areas: ¥1,000

When in the area of Kubokawa Station, a transfer point on the journey, visitors are in the right place for a fun trip to the area's Chinka-bashi submersible bridges or to Iwamoto-ji Temple, one of the 88 sites on the Shikoku pilgrimage. 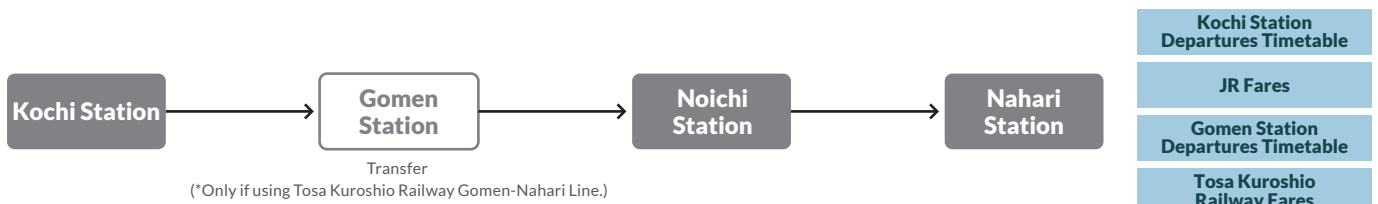

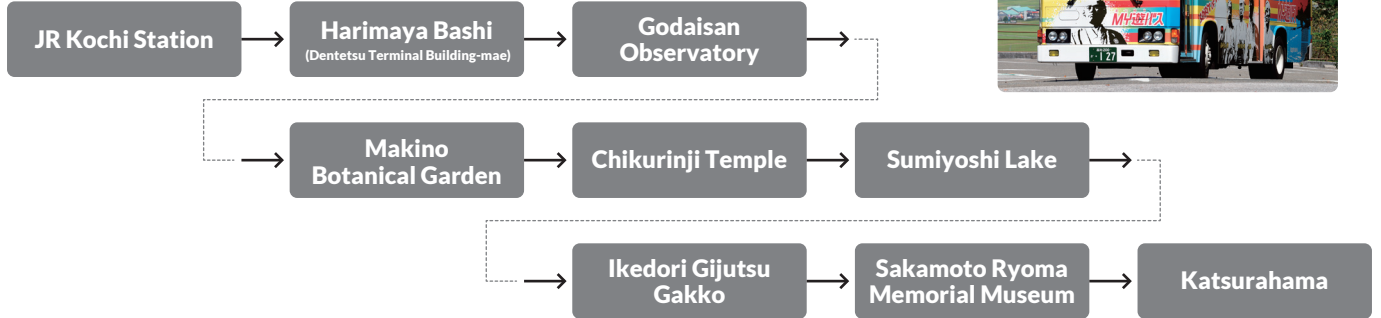

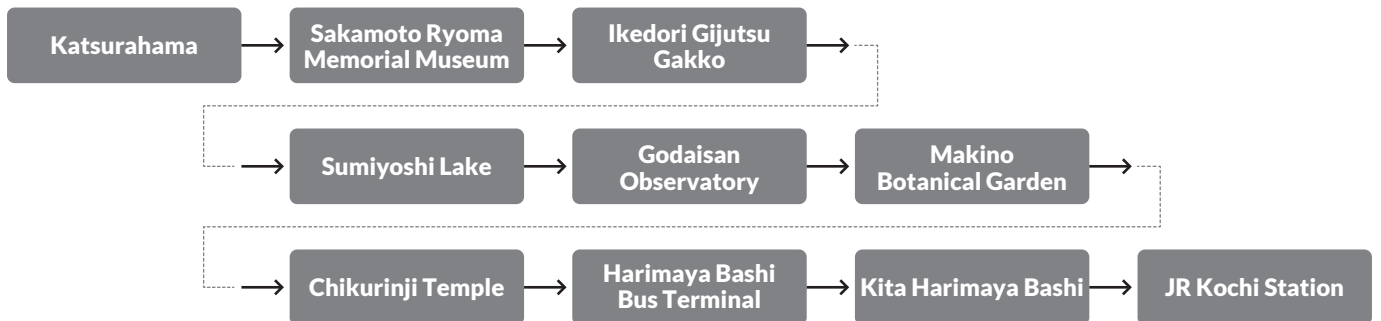
### Within Kochi City (My Yu Bus)



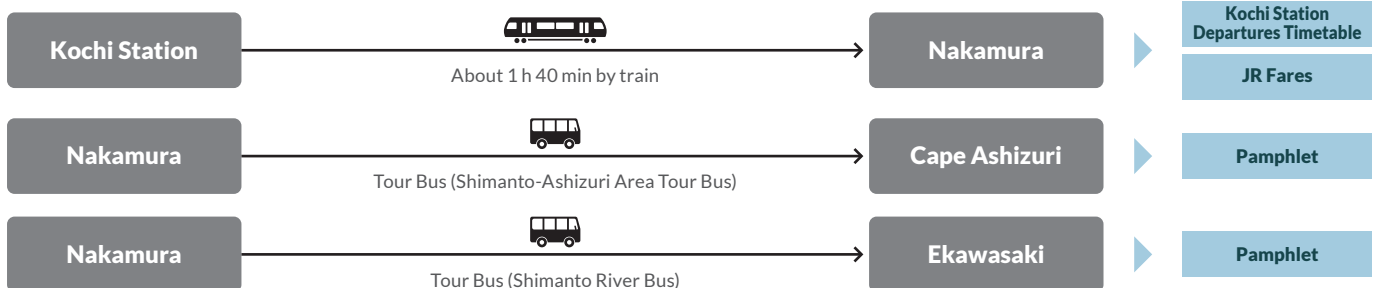
From JR Kochi Station

▶ Cycling Information

#### \*Important points regarding cycling

- There are 40 free bikes available (35 adult bicycles, and 5 children's (For kids around 10 years old))
- Bicycles cannot be reserved in advance. Also, bicycles are not rented out in rainy weather.
- Return bikes to Aki Jibasan Market during opening hours. Bikes cannot be left at locations other than Aki Station or sightseeing facilities.
